You can quickly search across all of the documents in this collection. To do so, you must:

- Run Adobe Acrobat or Adobe Reader in stand-alone mode (not inside a web browser window)
- Have Adobe Acrobat or a version of Reader that has the search plug-in. The full version of Adobe Reader is freely available at <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html>
- Have access to the search engine files on a CD-ROM, hard disk, or network share

To run Adobe Reader in stand-alone mode, launch it from the program item on your desktop or in your Start Menu. To search the documents on this CD, make sure that "What would you like to search" is set to "In the index named CM\_Servers\_Gateways3\_1.pdx" in the search pane. You can bring up the search pane:

- in Acrobat 7 by typing Ctrl+Shift+F or clicking Edit > Search or by clicking the Search CD link above
- in Acrobat 6 by typing Ctrl+F or clicking Edit > Search

When the PDF Search pane comes up inside a browser window, you can only search the document that you are currently viewing.
